Syllabus

Course Description

Music Technology I is an introduction to the use of computers in the creation of music. We will focus on the use of Finale music notation software, MIDI format, and—time willing—some music production software.

Course Goals

- Demonstrate beginning knowledge of Finale music notation software.
- Engrave music in a manner that is “camera-ready” (ready for publication).
- Demonstrate knowledge of MIDI history and protocol.
- Begin learning the basic elements of sequencing.

Course Materials

- Your assignments will be submitted by e-mail, so you will have to maintain an e-mail account and check it for updates throughout the semester. Please inform me if you change your e-mail address.
- You will need to purchase a data storage device in order to save your work. An USB flash drive is recommended, but any portable media supported by the machines (USB or Firewire) in the lab will suffice. REMEMBER TO SAVE! If something happens to the file or computer in the lab, and you do not have a backup copy, you will have to start over from scratch (nothing I can do).
- The user manuals of the software we use will be considered required reading for this course. There are no further texts to buy.
